Meeting a Critical Need

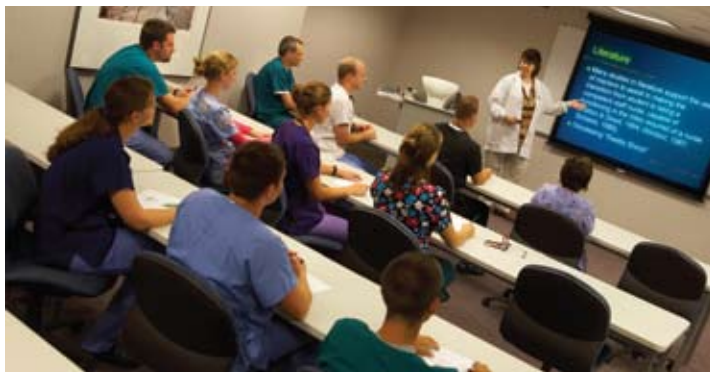

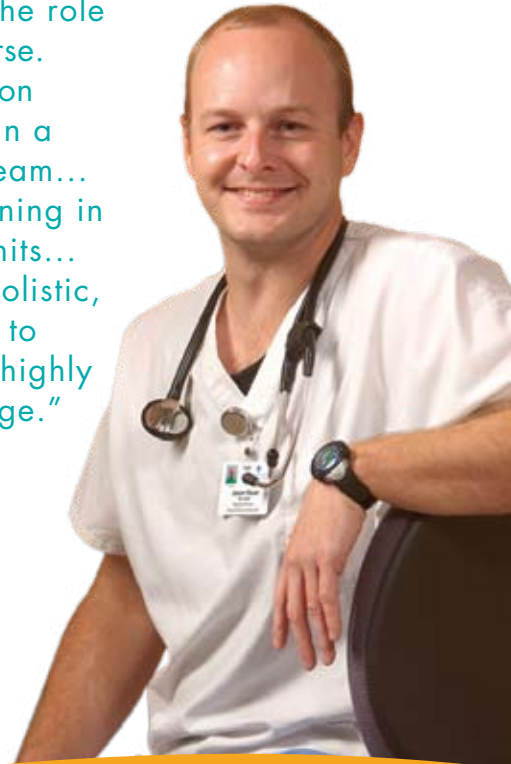
